Dear Friends,

When I was in seminary, I took a class on preaching. I had to give a dozen sermons and each one was reviewed by the professor as well as the class. It was painful to hear people tear apart something you had spent a lot of time, prayer and energy in creating, but it was helpful and their critiques have turned out to be a blessing in my ministry. At the end of the class, the professor took me aside, something he did not do with everyone. Here is what he told me.

He said, "When I went to my first pulpit, I loved to preach. It was my great strength and my great love in ministry. I was good at it and I knew it. When I was ready to leave, one of the saints of that congregation took me aside and told me how much they had appreciated my preaching. She said that my sermons were biblically sound and that she had learned more from me than from any other preacher she had ever heard. She said that my sermons were nearly always thought-provoking and challenging. My chest and head were growing from this praise. Then she added, but one thing you forget is that the gospel is supposed to be good news. At your next church let people hear the words of comfort and encouragement and blessing that are available to them in Jesus."

He said, "I went back and looked over every sermon I had preached to that congregation (I had saved them all) and I saw that she was right. My sermons were biblical and challenging, but they were not good news. I realized that I had failed that congregation in ways that I had not even realized. I resolved to do better in my next church." He said, "Go back and look over the 12 sermons you preached for the class and you'll see that you have the same problem."

I didn't need to look them over; I knew that he was right as soon as he said it. I was devastated. What preacher wants to hear that what he has to say is not good news? Like my professor before me, I resolved to do better, to make sure that people heard from me of the comfort, encouragement, blessing and hope that are available to them in Jesus. I have tried to make that the center of my work in every church I have ever served.

This month in worship we will be focusing on all the blessings our Lord has given to us and all that are yet in store. Our theme will be "All That God Has Given Us". We will be focusing on the following themes: "Freedom", "Grace and Mercy", "Peace", and "Abundant Life". Our Lord gives these to all who call upon the name of Christ, but He always has even more to give. Come this month and hear the good news.

## BRING YOUR BIBLE TO WORSHIP!

We have been emphasizing the importance of Bible Study and the importance of worship in our worship services during the month of September. We talk about Bible study in small groups because we believe that they are the key to helping us to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ. We have been talking about worship because worship is central to what the church is all about. It is fundamental to our lives as Christians, yet many do not realize just what worship is all about and how critical it is to our growth as disciples of Jesus Christ.

As a church, one of our main beliefs is that the Bible is the **inspired word of God and deserves to have authority over our lives**. One of our main goals is to help our congregation know the Bible. This means not only learning about what the Bible says (the words on the screen) but also becoming familiar and comfortable with the Bible, learning how to find Bible passages and understand any notes our Bible may have. These goals are only achieved with practice and experience.

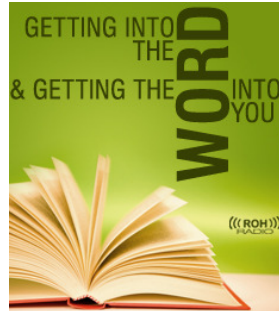
Therefore, we have intentionally move toward these goals by asking everyone to **bring their Bible to worship with them**. We will no longer be putting the Bible texts on the screen, and instead, we encourage everyone to follow along in their own Bible. Since you will bring your own Bible to worship, you might consider taking notes in your Bible, highlighting or underlining passages that really stand out to you, or using sticky notes to mark passages you'd like to study more.

and get to know it more and more.**



Each Sunday, prior to worship, you have an opportunity to gather in the sanctuary for prayer. All are invited to ask God to fill the seats and to bless those who would sit in them during worship; that they might hear and receive the message that God wants them to have.

All are invited to join in bathing the sanctuary in prayer 15 minutes prior to the service. Unless you are praying, the sanctuary will open five minutes before the service begins. A prayer suggestion list is available at the back of the sanctuary.

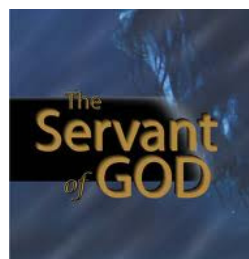

#### What is Kairos?

The people of Kairos are called by God to share the love of Christ with those impacted by incarceration. Kairos encourages believers from a variety of Christian traditions to be volunteers in this Christ-filled ministry.

Kairos programs offer to prison residents, their families, and those who work with them, the opportunity to receive God's forgiveness through faith in Jesus Christ, and to grow in their faith and servanthood in Christian community.

**Kairos is coming the last weekend of October.** Kairos is one of the missions of the church and we need your participation in several ways:

- ♦ **Pray for the inmates:** That their hearts be opened to the word of Jesus. See Steve Hamm to get your name on the prayer chain. It is pretty impressive as that paper chain is wrapped around and around the room from Christians all over the world.
- ♦ **Your financial support:** Write your check to Eagle UMC and mark it for Kairos.
- ♦ **Cookies:** Our pledge is 300 dozen. Please sign up on the table in the foyer and say how many you can



make. They need to be frozen and will be collected the last week of October. Pick up a recipe from the table in the narthex.

- ♦ And finally, **letters of encouragement:** Let the men in blue know that you are praying for them.

Beginning Sunday, October 2nd, there will be a table in the narthex where you can write a note of encouragement to an inmate. We will supply the writing materials and an example of what you might write. It will only take a few minutes of your time. The idea is that each of us write one letter expressing the love and forgiveness of our Lord and telling the men that *they* are worthy of being loved and forgiven. Your participation would help us give many, many letters. You can quote your favorite scripture verse and tell the men how God can work in their lives with forgiveness and redemption.

You can also make a placemat – these are treasured by the men especially if done by a child. Any letters or placemats need to be signed with first name only and in the case of youth or children, their age. With your help this can be the best Kairos ever. Thank you from your Kairos team.



### **PRESCHOOL**

The 3's and 4's have their very own class in the "new" preschool room. They're off on a faith-filled, high energy journey with the Live B.I.G. curriculum. They will be meeting characters who model B.I.G. (Belief in God) behavior and enjoying contemporary music with their friends.

### **KINDERGARTEN - 5TH GRADE**

Our new program for K-5 students is off and running. We have started our first unit (Digging into the Bible) with rotational model curriculum. During the first week, the kindergarten/first grade kids got to taste foods from Bible times and make "Scripture Bake" cookies. The second and third graders had fun in the games station learning about the books of the Bible. Fourth and fifth graders learned about the history of the Bible and went on an archeological dig. There's more learning and fun coming as all of the students will rotate through six stations: art, cooking, games, music, science, and storytelling/video. If you missed the first week, it's not too late to jump in and join the fun. Students are gathering in the Fellowship Hall with their adult shepherds prior to beginning their station of the week. Parents should meet their children back in the Fellowship Hall at the end of the Sunday School hour.

### **MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL CLASSES**

Sixth and seventh graders have started Confirmation class—an important step in their faith development. The eighth and ninth graders are an energetic and enthusiastic group which has gotten off to a great start, as have the tenth-twelfth grade high schoolers.

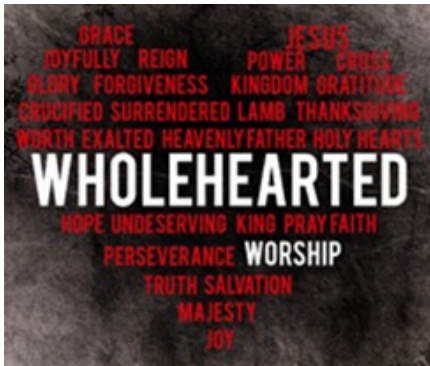
**8:00pm.** We will have a potluck dinner and a costume contest. There will be games, activities, and a spook house that won't be too spooky for the little ones.

We encourage you to pray for this project and then become involved by filling an empty shoebox with:

**TOYS:** small cars, balls, dolls, jump ropes, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, small Etch-A-Sketch®, toys that light up or make



noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, etc.

**SCHOOL SUPPLIES:** pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

**HYGIENE ITEMS:** toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

**OTHER:** Hard candy and lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries).

**A PERSONAL NOTE:** In a separate envelope, you may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may write back.

**INCLUDE YOUR DONATION**

**Please donate \$7** or more for each shoe box you prepare to help cover shipping and other project costs by writing a check to EUMC with *Samaritan's Purse* on the memo line. Place it in an envelope on top of the gift items inside your box.

**Do Not Include:** Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow-globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

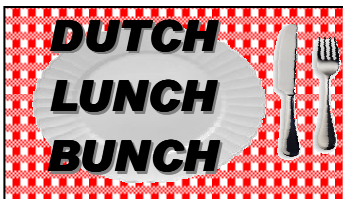

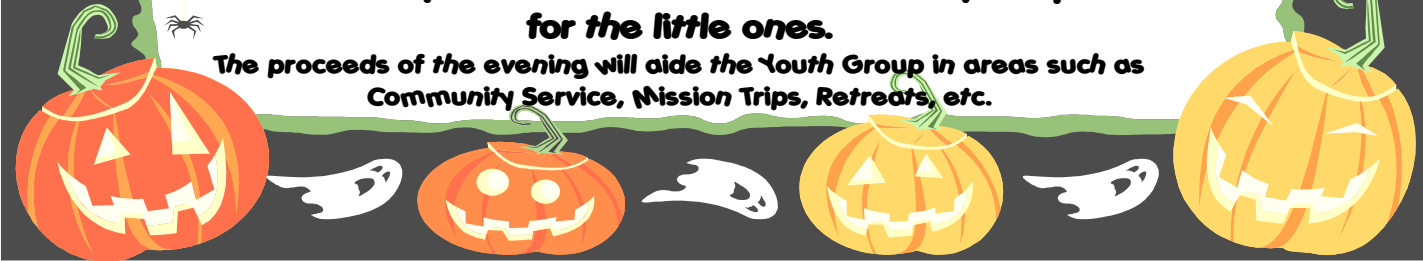
